### Dear All Welcome to our Summer Update

#### Learners

A lot of activity recently on the learner front with lots of new referrals. A few have come from the Job Centre, others from the Forest Drop-In, the Forest Upcycling Project, the Independent Trust and three via friends. I have managed to match some of them already and the others are in the pipeline.

#### Training

- The recent Extension Training session at the Forest Community Church was very successful. #### **Talking Books Update**

A couple of our reading coaches have been trialling a few of the audio books with their learners (more information and photos on the website).

Ryan who works with Fiona at the Upcycling Project has passed on some very helpful feedback (below). Our coaches have been brilliant in giving up their time to do the reading and have been very forgiving when things haven't always gone to plan! I shall be asking one or two more learners to help out with the trial, so if you think your learner would be interested please let me know.

#### Feedback from Ryan:

Ryan enjoyed testing out the devices and says that he would be interested in using the scheme at home. He preferred the mini-cube and felt confident about using it, however, he didn't think that he would use earphones. He does have a computer at home but was very taken with the mini-cube and felt that its portability was a real benefit. He also pointed out that the display on the mini-cube made it easier to navigate around the different tracks than the 'Sovereign'.

Ryan was comfortable reading the Readwell Road, step 2 book and that the speed was fine. We also tried a step 3 and he was equally happy with that. He would be interested in trying out some more difficult books with this scheme. He also quite enjoyed completing the related activity sheets.



**Contacts Team – Update from Megan** We have just had some basic flyers printed at a minimal cost, as although our glossy leaflets are useful for distributing to coaches and potential funders, it was suggested that we have something in a simpler format to attract new learners. If anyone would like a few of these to distribute in their local areas

We have had a presence at several events this year and some have been more productive than others.

- The opening of the new Yorkley Community Centre was very well attended and elicited a good response with lots of interest particularly from potential coaches.
