Since the last Lockdown we have been concentrating on reminding Forest organisations and residents of FRED's presence and the help we can give. We have refreshed our leaflets and posters, set up our display at several local events, attended meetings with support teams and kept our internet presence relevant and topical.

I am pleased to say that we have retained most of our trained coaches and have attracted several new volunteers whom we hope will soon join them. Most importantly we have been able to continue to support our learners to improve their reading and writing and there continue to be good examples of individuals progressing.

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A Ukrainian Story by Claire Peach




Viktoriya fled Ukraine with almost nothing, after the Russian invasion. Leaving the rest of her family behind, she escaped first to Poland, where she spent three uncertain weeks with her two young children, a toddler and a 7 year old, waiting for a visa. In April she arrived in the UK and was given accommodation by a young couple who helped her in many ways. But she was determined to get a job as soon as possible, so she can support her children. She is a qualified dentist and already spoke fairly good English, but discovered that she needs to reach a high standard in the IELTS (International English Language Testing System) an academic English test, to get a job that will enable her to be self-sufficient.

In July, she heard about FRED and asked if we could help. Although her needs were not within the usual remit of FRED, I offered to help her with preparation for the demanding IELTS exam. The 1 to 1 sessions had to be done remotely as Viktoriya had no child care so a lively toddler and poor signal strength on her phone were just two of the challenges!

Happily, in August, FRED received more refurbished laptops from IT Schools Africa, and this made things a lot easier for her to study on line and Viktoriya sat the IELTS exam in late September. Despite registering to take the exam in hand-written format, when Viktoriya got to the test centre, she found she had to take the test on-line, which put her at a disadvantage. She managed to good overall grade, get a unfortunately not good enough for the job she is aiming for, so she has rebooked for December.

Despite now having to move into rental accommodation and transfer her daughter to another school, Viktoriya does not complain, and simply says 'I have to do it - I am the lucky one, being able to live in the UK'.
